## Signal's Greenhill wins Scenic City Trail Marathon women's division

Clear skies and the promise of warm temperatures met the 45 marathoners and 147 half marathoners who turned out for the second annual Scenic City Trail Marathon and Half on Raccoon Mountain. The two trail running races, presented by Rock/Creek and Vasque, raised \$3,300 for The Wilderness Trail Running Association, aka Boonies.

Proceeds from both events are used to run trail races, develop new and maintain existing trails in the Chattanooga area.

John Cobbs of Birmingham, Ala., won the event with a time of 3:38:04. Rock/Creek Race Team member Jaelyn

Greenhill, of Signal Mountain, came in less than a minute back to win the women's division with a time of 3:38:49.

"We couldn't have asked for a better day or a better venue for the run," said race director Jamie Sanders. "Everyone had a great time out there today."

The Scenic City Trail Marathon is part of the Rock/Creek Trail Series, a year-long trail running race series with nine race dates and 13 distance options.
